NOTICE TO WINTER QUARTER CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

The Committee on University Functions is arranging for a dinner on March 22nd at which degrees will be conferred on those who complete their work at the close of the current quarter and who wish to receive their degrees at this time. All such students should make arrangements at once with their instructors for final examinations, as final reports are due in the Registrar's Office on March 15.

Students wishing to defer the receipt of their degrees until June may do so, and such students will report for final examinations at the regularly scheduled time at the close of the quarter.

WINTER QUARTER COMMENCEMENT

The Administrative Committee of the Senate at their meeting Wednesday, March 7, voted to have degrees conferred and diplomas issued to students completing their work at the close of the current quarter at a dinner which has been arranged by the University Committee on Functions for Thursday evening, March 22.

Copies of a tentative list of candidates for degrees in March will be sent on Friday, March 9, to the head of each department, where they may be obtained by members of the teaching staff.

Students whose names appear on this list are entitled to the privilege of an early examination in order that their names may appear on the commencement program, if all of their work for the current quarter is satisfactorily completed.

Final grades for the work of the current quarter for all students on the list, in accordance with the action of the University Senate, are due in the office of the Registrar not later than Thursday, March 15. Instructors are requested to make every effort to comply with this regulation to insure that no student entitled to receive his degree at this time is omitted on account of failure to receive reports on final grades.

SPRING QUARTER FEES

1. Spring Quarter fee statements have been mailed to all students now registered at the University. March 24 is the last date on which payment will be accepted without penalty. The penalty for late payment is \$2.00 until April 4, and on that date increases at the rate of \$1.00 per day until fees are paid. Students who must write home for money or make loans are urged to complete such arrangements within the specified time.

2. Fees may be paid in person at the Bursar's Window, or by mail. If by mail, the return envelope received with fee statement should be used. The Bursar's Office is open each week day from 8:30 a.m. to 12 m. and 1:00 to 5:00 p.m., except Saturdays. On Saturdays the office closes at noon. Remittances made after Saturday noon, March 24, should be by mail.

3. All checks, drafts and money orders should be made payable to The University of Minnesota, and should be accompanied by all three sections of the fee statement.

4. Remittances must be for the exact amount of the fee statement. The Bursar cannot accept checks, drafts or money orders for amounts in excess of the fee statement. Insufficient remittances will be returned to the student at his own risk. The student's registration will remain incomplete until his fees are paid in full.

5. Failure to receive a fee statement cannot be accepted as sufficient reason for late payment or non-payment of fees. Any

student who does not receive a fee statement in his University post-office box within a reasonable time may secure a duplicate fee statement at the Registrar's Office. Students whose work takes them from the campus must inform the Registrar's Office promptly of change of address.

6. Students using "War Service" tuition, trainees of the U. S. Veterans' Bureau, of the State Division of Re-Education, Foreign Government students, and beneficiaries of the scholarship funds of miscellaneous war-time agencies must secure the written approval of the Assistant Registrar on their fee statements and present them to the Bursar within the above time limit in order to avoid penalty for late payment.

NOTICE OF SPRING QUARTER REGISTRATION

College of Science, Literature, and the Arts

Freshmen and Sophomores, who have not registered for the Spring Quarter must register before March 10. Necessary changes in registration by those who have already registered must be made during the same period. Registration and change of registration will be by appointment only. Appointment may be made in Room 106, Folwell. Appointments should be made early. Those who delay may find courses for which they wish to register filled to capacity.

Notice to Sophomores

Regular Registration in the Senior College: Sophomores who will have completed the Junior College requirements at the end of this quarter, and desire to enter the Senior College on April 4, will be expected to register before March 10.

Provisional Registration in the Senior College: Sophomores who will have earned 90 credits and 90 honor points but who will not have quite completed all other Junior College requirements at the end of this quarter, and desire to enter the Senior College, will probably be allowed to register provisionally in the Senior College before March 10.

Registration Procedure: Sophomores to whom these notices apply should report to the appropriate window, Registrar's Office, and request a memorandum of their Junior College work, which must be taken immediately to the Senior College clerk, Room 106, Folwell Hall, who will supply further instructions to complete registration.

Notice to Juniors

Juniors who have not registered for the Spring Quarter, or who may desire to make a change of registration, should report to Room 106, Folwell Hall, before March 10, and ask the Senior College clerk for a set of instructions.
