Duluth --- Applications for Danforth Graduate Fellowships must be received by UMD Academic Dean Thomas W. Chamberlin no later than Oct. 14.

The Fellowships, awarded in March by the Danforth Foundation of St. Louis, Mo., are open to seniors or recent graduates who have a serious interest in college teaching as a career and who plan to study for a Ph.D. in a field common to the undergraduate college.

Applicants may be single or married, must be less than 30 years of age and may not have undertaken any graduate or professional study beyond the baccalaureate.

Approximately 120 Fellowships will be awarded next March following nomination by liaison officers at undergraduate institutions.

The Fellows are eligible for four years of financial assistance, with a maximum annual living stipend of \$1800 for single Fellows and \$2200 for married fellows, plus tuition and fees. Dependency allowances are available. Financial need is not a condition for consideration.
