DULUTH--Contemporary, romantic and late Baroque idioms will be combined in a UMD University String Quartet and harpsichord concert at 8:15 p.m., Feb. 25 at Recital Hall in the Humanities building.

The quartet is composed of James Smith, first violinist; Janet Smith, 2nd violinist; Robert House, 'cello; and Ralph Anderson, violist. They will perform Dvorak's "Quartet No.6," also known as the "American," opus 96.

Lindsley Edson will play the "D Minor Suite for Clavier" by Handel on the UMD music department's new harpsichord. And the string ensemble will present Prokofieff's "2nd string Quartet."

Chamber music, typified by both string quartet and harpsichord performance media, will mark the recital as an innovation for persons who enjoy the "intimacy" this idiom features.
