Duluth -- Tickets for the lecture by Illinois Senator Everett M. Dirksen will be available to the public beginning Friday (Apr. 1) at UMD's Kirby Student Center Information Desk or the KDAL-TV studios in the Bradley Building.

Senator Dirksen, minority leader of the 86th Congress, will deliver the fourth Dalton LeMasurier Memorial Lecture at 2:30 p.m. April 17 in the UMD Physical Education building.

The lecture honors the memory of Dalton LeMasurier, former president and founder of KDAL radio and television, who died in a 1957 air crash in Wyoming.

The Dirksen talk is open to the public at no charge, but tickets must be secured in advance. Persons who previously sent mailed requests for tickets will receive them early next week, according to UMD officials.

Persons who still wish to send for tickets should send a stamped, return address envelope to "LeMasurier Lecture," University of Minnesota, Duluth, Minn. 55812. No mailed requests will be honored past April 13.

About 4,000 tickets are available for the April 17th event.

Previous LeMasurier lecturers were CBS Newsman Eric Sevareid, historian Arnold J. Toynbee and Association Justice William O. Douglas.
