The University of Minnesota, Duluth(UMD) was established by legislative act on July 1, 1947, succeeding Duluth State Teachers College and Duluth State Normal.

During its first 15 years, \$11,000,000 was spent to construct and equip its striking, contemporary-styled buildings on a new 200 acre site in the eastern section of Duluth. Another \$16,000,000 will be required before completion of the campus plan in 1970. All buildings will be interconnected to provide year-around comfort and efficiency, a campus design unique in the nation.

It is estimated that more than \$7,000,000 is spent annually in the Duluth area by UMD and its faculty, staff and students.

UMD's enrollment has increased eight years in a row to the present 3,189 undergraduate and graduate students. The figure is expected to reach the 4,000 mark by 1966.

UMD is one of four campuses of the University of Minnesota. More than 1,000 courses are offered through UMD's four academic divisions: Education and Psychology, Humanities, Science and Mathematics, and Social Science. The Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps operates as an independent department.

UMD students may choose one of four degrees: Associate in Arts, Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science and Master of Arts. The Master's program offers four possible majors: education, curriculum and administration, educational psychology and English.

A broad Summer Session program featuring special institutes, seminars and workshops annually attracts both undergraduate and graduate student from across the nation.
